Primarily volunteers are scraping and removing glaze and caulk from the windows. The work is not hard, but it does take time. If manual labor is not your preference we also need volunteers to provide lunches on Saturday. By helping them you will not only be assisting them with the work to be done but you will also have some great Christian Fellowship and help keep the costs down for the congregation.

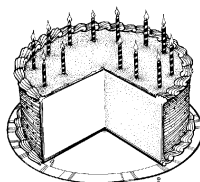

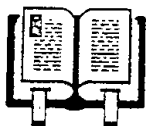

Emergency Preparedness

Trinity's Emergency Planning Committee has been meeting frequently to discuss Trinity's response in the event of an emergency within the congregation or the community. One result of their planning is an Emergency Reference Guide located by every phone in the building (all offices, the sound room, the student center and the main kitchen). These reference guides include information on dealing with almost any type of emergency situation. The Committee is also in the process of setting up an Emergency Room in the building which will include wheelchairs, a stretcher, emergency medical supplies, a weather radio, flashlights and other emergency equipment.

Below you will find information on what to do in case of fire or severe weather during worship or other activities at the church. If you would like more information, feel free to contact the church office at 279-3609.

Severe Weather Warning:

We are now entering another season during which severe weather is a possibility during functions here at Trinity. What should we do if there is a warning given? What do we do if there is a storm that give no warning?

The Sanctuary is not the place to be during severe weather because of the large number of windows and high roof which make it dangerous in a storm. The congregation is asked to exit the Sanctuary and go to the undercroft level in the basement. People in the back half of the church can exit the Sanctuary on the outside aisles (window side of pews) and proceed to the stairs on either end of the narthex to go down to the undercroft. The Nursery and Mother's Room would provide the best protection; the restrooms can also provide protection. People in the front half of the church can exit out the left front, down the stairs to the undercroft; or out the east doors, down the hall to the north stairs, and to the hallway in the lower level where refuge can be taken in the hallway, the restrooms, or a Sunday school classroom.

Sunday School children in class should remain in their classroom, sit on the floor against a west wall, and cover their heads. Adults and students in the upstairs classrooms or in the gym should move to the lower level by the closest route possible. Remain in these protected areas until an all clear signal is received from weather reports.

If we must evacuate the Sanctuary we should remember to look for and assist any handicapped or elderly people who might need assistance.

If a storm hits without warning, an effort should be made to exit the Sanctuary, and if this becomes impossible, the only protection available would be under the pews.

Any time severe weather is a threat, a member of the Emergency Planning Committee will be using the weather radio to monitor the situation. If an alert is given that affects us, the congregation will be notified immediately.

Fire:

In the event of a fire, move to the nearest exit and go outside. Again, please look for and assist any handicapped or elderly people to exit the building. When you have left the building, go to the area by the garage and call 911 to report the fire. **DO NOT GO BACK INTO THE BUILDING FOR ANY REASON!** If any exit is blocked by fire, move to another exit. See the list above for exits from the Sanctuary and acquaint yourself with other exits from the building. Do not attempt to move your car; the driveway must be kept clear for emergency vehicles. Cars can be moved later at the request of police or fire officials. The importance of going to a central location (by the garage) is to reduce the potential for panic if families or friends are separated while leaving the building.

Treasurer's Report: Another \$10,000 borrowed in May. Bev reported that LCEF wants us to start repayment of the line of credit. Motion made to make \$1000/month (principal & interest) payment on LOC and council will look at the amount in early fall to see if we can increase. Passed.

Trustees: Chuck coordinating planting of memorial tree. Laborers for Christ working on window project. Volunteers are needed to help them. Copy machine lease expired; looking at getting new one. Looking at bids for removal of tree in parking lot.

Campus: Students working on Fall Activities Fair at Drake. Discussed proposed Student Lounge/Study area in undercroft area.

Education: No report from Education. Youth holding car wash on July 11 and picnic on August 30.

Outreach: Evangelism: Collecting large trash bags for Hope Ministries. Lutherans in Mission event at Christ the King in Altoona on Sept. 13. Will provide a table at the Drake Farmer's Market this summer. Encouraged members to wear name tags to welcome the new vicar. No reports from Global Ministry, Social Ministry or Mission Outreach.

Stewardship: No reports from any committees.

Public Relations: No report.

Fellowship: Disappointed at turnout at recent events. Coordinating with Fellowship Society for Jazz in July on the 10th. Ice Cream social follows. No report from Singles.

No reports from the President or Vicar as both are on vacation.

Pastor's Report: IDW convention next week. Will work at Okoboji July 12-18. Vicar gone July 5-11 to Okoboji. Vicar Lee farewell on July 26; Vicar Cundiff welcome on August 2 (moving in on the 1st). Good News membership class starts June 17. Synod discussing some restructuring within the synod, re: districts and changing name of LCMS to reflect more national/international level of the synod.

Business:

New constitution printed with approved changes to wording and board structure. All council members received a copy and were asked to look it over and submit errors/changes to Bev so corrections can be made and copies given to all voting members before October Voters' Assembly meeting.
